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About this Access Key

An Access Key is a document that describes a space and how to access it. Access Keys are used to describe the features of a venue. We hope this Access Key helps everyone feel confident to access our community health centre. Access Keys acknowledge that not all spaces are 100% accessible. By sharing this information about what is and what is not accessible, people with a disability have more agency and control over if and how they participate.

How to find Access Health and Community Hawthorn

Access Health and Community Hawthorn is located at 378 Burwood Road, Hawthorn.

The clinic is a red brick building and sits on the corner of Burwood Road and Kent Street.



Getting here by car

The best place to park is the <u>Kent Street car park</u>, which runs off Burwood Road. This is two hour parking for regular car parks.

Please refer to the signs in these parks as some are for council staff only. There are three accessibility car parks in the Kent Street car park, including one closest to the Kent street walking path and the Access Health and Community entry.

The other two accessibility car parks are close to the headspace Hawthorn entrance. There is another accessibility car park on Kent Street on the side of our Access Health and Community building.

The entrance to Access Health & Community is approximately 100 meters from the car park. Note that there are often gumnuts and twigs on the ground in the carpark.

There is more street parking on Burwood Road outside the Hawthorn Arts Centre between 7am and 9am. This is a towaway zone so we recommend parking in the Kent Street car park.

Getting here via tram

The closest tram stop is number 73 on tramline number 16. This is approximately 150 metres away from the building entrance. If you travel to our Hawthorn clinic by tram, you will need to cross at the intersection of Glenferrie Road and Burwood Road. The intersection is often quite busy with foot traffic, cars and trams. Once you cross the intersection, there is a slight incline on the footpath heading east up Burwood Road.



Getting here by train

The closest train stop is Glenferrie train station. This stop is on the Lilydale, Belgrave and Alamein train lines. The station is approximately 180 metres from the building entrance. Exit towards Glenferrie Road and turn left towards Burwood Road. Cross the intersection and walk up towards the Hawthorn Arts Centre on the right. Building entrance is on the right.






Building Entry

The building entrance has one (1) automatic sliding door. During COVID restrictions, you will be required to press the doorbell to notify reception staff of your arrival. You will find the doorbell on the left of the door. The ground is concrete tiles and can be slippery when wet. You will notice the Access Health & Community logo on and above the entrance door. 

Reception

The reception area has grey patterned carpet and a combination of natural and artificial lighting.

The reception desk is 47cm high.

The walls and lighting are both neutral. There are various signage and infographics around the room and on the walls.

There are a number of grey armchairs available for sitting in the waiting room.

The sound of the phone ringing can be heard from the waiting room as well as phone conversations.

People do come and go from the waiting room but there are never too many people at the one time.

There is a TV on the wall which can be switched on or off on request.








Image description: This is an elevator, which is down the end of the hallway from reception. There are grey chairs for clients to sit on. The lighting is artificial.



Toilet information

Walking down the hallway on your left you will see two doors to the toilets.

One has a sign for men and the other has a sign for women. There is a hand railing in the women's toilets but not in the men's.

On the ground level, you will find an accessibility bathroom with a parents' change table and a gender-neutral bathroom. All toilets have access to soap and running water to wash your hands.

These toilets are located via the stairs going down, opposite the level one toilets.

If you keeping walking down past the level one toilets, you will see an elevator on your right-hand side as another option to get to these toilets.

The doorway of the accessible toilet is 30cm wide and the sink is 30.5cm high from the ground.

There is a hand railing in here too.


